At Field of Honor ceremony on Veteran's Day, CAPT Bill Kelberlau presented the introduction of guest speaker, Sichan Siv. Mr. Siv was born in Pochentong, Cambodia. His entire family - 15 total, including his mother - were killed during Pol Pot's reign of terror. Originally, he was to be evacuated by the USS Hancock, Bill's assigned ship, but he was assisting other refugees and missed the opportunity. He eventually escaped and came to the United States.

He was the United States ambassador to the United Nations Economic and Social Council from 2001 to 2006 and Ambassador Siv served at The White House as deputy assistant to President George H. W. Bush and at the State Department as deputy assistant secretary.

Today, Ambassador Siv is an international best-selling author and is on the Texas Board of Criminal Justice.

The itinerary includes various activities and attractions at Kennedy Space Center, including the Space Shuttle Atlantis® and the Shuttle Launch Experience®, Kennedy Space Center Bus Tours (with handicap lifts), the Apollo/Saturn V Center, the Heroes and Legends featuring the U.S. Astronaut Hall of Fame®, an Astronaut Encounter, Planet Play, Rocket Garden guided tours, the Journey to Mars, 3D Space Films, character appearances, and other scheduled presentations and films. A quick lunch will be available at Kennedy Space Center at 12:30 PM, and the bus departs for the Cape Canaveral Cruise Terminal at 1:00 PM. Embarkation on the “Carnival Glory” takes place at 1:30 PM.

On Saturday, March 8, 2025, from 1000 to 1700, the ship will visit Nassau, the capital of The Bahamas. Walk-off on your own or select a ship excursion.

CNRIC Trivia post-1990 - OPERATION DESERT SHIELD/STORM.....Charley Cheney

Still have the names of the first CNRIC Units and members recalled for Operation Desert Shield on Friday, Sept 7, 1990 for notification & Tues, Sept 11, 1990 for Report for Duty - yes, I AM a packrat & subsequent recalls for Desert Storm after everything kicked off Super Bowl Sunday night in January 1991. These folks were mostly sent to London, with a few scattered around to Naples & a few were sent to either USAFORSCOM HQ or Fort Gillem (when the Atlanta JAC 0167 unit eventually landed). No idea about others from 0166, but suspect the "Inside The Beltway" crowd had a few I wasn't privy to.

I was the then-LCDR OIC of the Det from CINCUSNAVEUR 0167 out of RIA-14 in Atlanta (RIPO then-LCDR Hank Oldfield) & then-LCDR Steve Nichols was the OIC of the CINCUSNAVEUR0166 out of RIA-19. National players were CAPT Don McLeod and his assistant then-LTJG Marcie (nee Newlin) Wilson. NAVEUR's Reserve Coordinator was a TAR CDR Mitchell.

Names I can remember from the 0166 Det out of six (6) total were ISCM Ben Crew, LTJG Jim Scaminaci, ENS Mac Carey (took off from Dulles an IS3 & landed at Heathrow an ENS), plus a couple of others 34 years have erased from the memory banks. ISCM Crew may remember the other two.

It was quite an experience.....and you wouldn't believe how many folks called us in London after DESERT STORM kicked off begging to **NOT** be activated. I won't name names or the myriad of predictable reasons, but it was shockingly quite a big number...one or two got tapped anyway & **refused** to be activated....what **didn't** happen to them was a bit of a jolt, too, and a number of the folks listed below punched out when they got home. The head of Big Navy Intel had stated he only wanted "volunteers" so they would all presumably be "happy campers," so the change to Involuntary Recall for many became a major point of contention. Donnie McLeod can give you his perspective. But at the end of the day, no one received even a Letter of (**Fill in the Blank**), let alone any other kind of punishment. However, one or two did get "Don't ever send them back to CINCUSNAVEUR N2" messages back to 0167. Once the 90-day post ODS/ODS Drill Standdown was complete, they were allowed to transfer to other units, leave the Reserve, or whatever.

One additional observation: CNRIC & CINCUSNAVEUR N2 were the only organizations who figured out how to manipulate RUAD (Reserve Unit Assignment Document) to put those they wanted to recall "Above The Line" and everyone else "Below The Line." Entire units from Pittsburgh, Omaha, et al (but not Chicago - for some reason they weren't activated) showed up at #7 North Audley in support of N3, N4, N5, N6, etc., only to be sent home piecemeal at one of the initial 30-60-90-180-day windows. Those windows were another sore point with the initial N2 Atlanta deployers as they found it eventually evolved into "For the Duration." That said, once victory was declared, CNE N2 started sending a few home only after the Regulars started being allowed to PCS, get out, etc. And yes, for a brief while, Reserves were being held while Regulars were indeed PCSing. Another flail of the highest order. Our last group arrived back in Atlanta on April 4, 1991.
